#### Help for Ukraine.

We now have a new supply of greetings card produced by the local artist Liz and sold in aid of our Ukrainian Friends. These are priced at  $\pounds 2-50$  each or 5 for  $\pounds 10-00$ . They are on display on a table in the hall.

In time for Christmas 2024, the volunteer group "Helping Our Ukrainian Friends" will make its 19<sup>th</sup> delivery of aid to support those impacted by the war in Ukraine. The donations that we have made in the past have been gratefully appreciated by people in Ukraine. Let's see if we can continue with his generosity with this this Autumn's collection.

In particular we are being asked if we can provide the following:

- Medicines paracetamol, multivitamins, antiseptic wipes, cough medicines

- Equipment for hobbies Sports equipment, art supplies and musical instruments for displaced children and orphanages.
- Electronics Torches, batteries etc.

Note that they are not asking for clothes or toys.
