Responding to the reading

How would you define a 'prophet'?

The image that often comes to mind is around predicting the future, but that is only a small part of the idea of prophecy in the Bible – it's much more about speaking out against the powers, systems and structures of the present.

John the Baptist is one of the later prophets referred to in the Bible – coming as he does at the beginning of the New Testament story. His prophecy helps to create the space for Jesus' ministry, but he comes to a gruesome end...

In today's reading from the Gospel of Mark, John the Baptist is killed because of his prophecy and his confrontation with Herod. This passage speaks prophetically about what

happens when you come up against resistance and opposition, not least from those who have a stake in the power and systems under attack.

It certainly make for uncomfortable reading, but reminds us that we are called to challenge those things which don't measure up to God's vision.

What do we think? A few questions to consider and perhaps discuss with someone you trust this week:

- Drawing on recent history, who do you consider modern day prophets?
- Which issues and causes do you care passionately about?
- Inspired by John the Baptist and your modern prophets, how are you called to respond?

Prayers and Prayer Pointers

Monday 15th July

- Draw a picture of your local church. Include on the picture all the ways you see God at work, and all the things you want to ask God to work in.
- Pray about it.

Tuesday 16th July

- Make a cup or tea or coffee, or something else to drink. As you drink it, imagine all the places and people that are responsible for making it, from source to your lips.
- Thank God for them, the source of all life.

Wednesday 17th July

- Sit silently for ten minutes and let your mind wander. Offer any thoughts and feelings to God.

Thursday 18th July

- Take a moment to notice the sky today.
- Whether it is sunny and clear where you are, or mostly cloudy, you could spend a few minutes perhaps several times throughout the day noticing what is happening above you.
- As you look to the sky, see the vastness of God's creation, stretched out above you. Notice your own smallness, and the smallness of some of the worries and concerns that have been consuming you.
- Give the smallnesses to God, and allow the divine bigness to wash over you.

Friday 19th July

- Today, when you are washing your hands, or in the shower, or brushing your teeth, or even when you are doing the washing up – you could notice the water, falling from the tap or the shower head. You might like to pray these simple words:
- Living God, thank you for the water of life that you give to us. Thank you for the privilege of clean water that I can rely on. Thank you that you wash away all that is sinful and broken in me. Thank you for the water. Amen.

Saturday 20th July

- Gracious God, I know you have plans for me- plans for me to be a part of your kingdom and an agent of love in the world.
- Today, show me how to respond to the invitations I might receive. Help me to be open to the opportunities to share your love.
- In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.
